Next Week: The Feast of Corpus Christi



The Feast of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ) was established in Liège, France in 1246 at the urging of St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon. In 1264, Pope Urban IV extended its observance to the Universal Church.

This feast honors the Real Presence of Christ in the

mystery of the Holy Eucharist. At a time when there was little reverence for Our Lord in the Holy Sacrament, this feast initiated a renewal of Eucharistic devotion. This devotion expressed itself in liturgical practices such as the elevation of the Host and Chalice after the consecration at Mass, exposing the Blessed Sacrament on the altar in a monstrance for adoration, and a solemn procession of Our Lord through the streets with three or four Benedictions of the Blessed Sacrament at fixed stations.

In a day and age when reverence for Jesus' Real Presence in the Sacrament seems to be waning, Fr. Anthony established a great celebration of Corpus Christi at St. Peter's to counter this loss of reverence. When Jesus is properly revered in the Blessed Sacrament, so many of the ills we see in the Church and the world will be healed.

We will have our traditional celebration on Saturday, June 17, the eve of Corpus Christi, at the 5:00 PM Mass. After Mass we will march in a grand procession with the Blessed Sacrament through the streets of Merchantville, proclaiming the Eucharistic Christ as Lord and Master of our parish and our town. Come out and publicly witness to your own Eucharistic faith to a world so much in need of Him.

Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the altar!

O Christ, let me glorify Your goodness and mercy to the last moment of my life, with every drop of my blood and every beat of my heart. Would that I be transformed into a hymn of adoration of You. When I find myself on my deathbed, may the last beat of my heart be a loving hymn glorifying Your unfathomable mercy. Amen.

Reading I – Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

Early in the morning Moses went up Mount Sinai as the LORD had commanded him, taking along the two stone tablets.

Having come down in a cloud, the LORD stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, "LORD."
