Sacraments

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM - Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday at 12:15pm. Parents are expected to attend a Pre-Jordan Baptism class. Please call the Rectory to register for a class so that we have adequate materials. Godparents and children are welcome to attend.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE - In order to accommodate our own Parishioners, only Parishioners of St. Peter (Bride or Groom) will be able to be married in St. Peter Church. Couples planning to marry at St. Peter are expected to contact the priest to arrange a date and time first. Second, they must attend the Pre-Cana Conferences as mandated by the Bishop. The period of preparation for marriage is a minimum of six months to ensure completion of all arrangements before the wedding date. For Pre-Cana reservations call 663-1373. Only Parish Musicians are permitted for Wedding Masses. NO EXCEPTIONS.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - The priests may be called at any time day or night for the Sacrament of the Sick. Furthermore, the priests will be happy to visit the Sick with Holy Communion upon request.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - (Confessions) Saturday from 4:00-4:55pm and 7:00-8:00 pm or contact one of the priests.

FUNERALS - The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. Viewings in the Church are not permitted. Funeral Masses are scheduled at 10:00am. No eulogies in church, and only Parish Musicians are permitted for Funeral Masses, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Ask a Priest



Q1. I don't understand the reluctance of a hand shake at the Sign of Peace. We breathe the same air and touch the same door handles to enter the Church. I don't think that not shaking hands is going to keep anyone from getting sick. Then everyone shakes the priest's hand after Mass ... I don't get it.

A1. Not being a medical professional, I cannot address the health issues behind someone's reluctance to expose themselves in a crowd by shaking hands. The points you raise about selective exposure are good ones. In the end, we must respect everyone's decision on this matter and not hold it against them if they refuse. Some people have significant health conditions which would dictate that they be more cautious than most others.

Q2. What is the reason for the host and wine being consecrated separately rather than together?

A2. The reason for this practice follows directly from the Last Supper. Jesus, following the Jewish Passover ritual, fulfilled and transformed the Passover meal into the first Mass. He consecrated the bread and wine separately, and said to his apostles, "Do this in memory of me". So, we have done this since the first Holy Thursday.

Q3. My daughter asked a question. If we are descendants of Adam and Eve, aren't we all related? And aren't we all the same race? And is Cain roaming the earth? Did Adam and Eve have more children besides Seth? How did she bear all those children?

A3. This is a profound question for a young girl. I commend her for her thoughtfulness. She is right! We are all descended from Adam and Eve, and thus we are all brothers and sisters. Our first parents had children other than Cain, Abel and Seth. We don't know how many, but the human race grew slowly from this first family. After Cain murdered his brother, he was banished from the region of his immediate family (he wandered the earth, as it were). Exactly how God marked Cain after his sin we do not know. Even in Noah's time there were few people on earth. After the flood, the world's population grew exponentially over time. Just like today, parents have children who do not necessarily resemble one another, so too in those days. As the subsequent generations of children dispersed throughout the world, their features became more distinct based on hereditary and environmental factors. So today we have distinct families of peoples, which we call different races. In fact, your daughter is right again. Ultimately, we are all members of one race, the *human race*. Thus, the conflicts between peoples and nations are scandals and gravely sinful before God our Creator.


